

### **Stephanos Efthymiadis**

Stephanos Efthymiadis, OUC associate professor in the Undergraduate course Studies in Greek Civilization, studied Law (University of Athens) and Greek Literature (University of Crete). He holds a PhD Degree in Byzantine Studies from the University of Oxford (1988-1992) which he read under the supervision of Cyril Mango and the support of the Greek State Scholarships Foundation. Thanks to a grant which he received from the British Academy and the University of Oxford he collaborated with C. Mango in the edition of the correspondence of Ignatios the Deacon, a ninth-century Byzantine scholar. In 1998 he published the critical edition of the Life of the Patriarch Tarasios, an important text for the study of Byzantine Iconoclasm (Ashgate, England). In the years 1994-1995 he worked as a research associate in Dumbarton Oaks Center for Byzantine Studies (Washington, D.C.). He taught Byzantine History in the Department of Social Anthropology at the University of the Aegean (Mytilene, Greece). He was assistant professor of Byzantine literature at the University of Ioannina, Greece, for the years 2001-2007 and visiting professor at the Central European University (C.E.U.) in Budapest, Hungary. In April-May 2007 he gave four lectures at the University of Paris I (La Sorbonne) on "Writing and Re-writing in Byzantium". He has participated in many international congresses and has published a lot of articles on Byzantine hagiography, historiography, epistolography, historical geography and prosopography. Together with Andreas Mazarakis he has edited the dossier of the French archaeologist Felix Sartiaux who excavated in Phocaea during the troubled years of 1913-1922. Also he is currently the editor of a collective Handbook on Byzantine Hagiography, forthcoming in Ashgate, England.
